Volunteers Needed

The Green Lake County Food Pantry is looking for people to help with the many activities required to provide food to needy families.

Volunteers are needed to help at the Food Pantry, 500 Lake Steel Street. The pantry is open every Tuesday from 10:00 to noon to distribute food. Volunteers arrive between 9:15 - 9:45 a.m. and stay until noon to 1:00pm.

Volunteers are also needed to help with food delivered to the pantry. These deliveries occur routinely on Mondays and Thursdays from 9:45 to noon. There are also other deliveries scattered throughout the month at various times.

Another volunteering activity involves using your car to drive to locations that either donate food to the pantry or collect food donated to the pantry. These locations include the Library and Piggly Wiggly in Princeton, Webster's in Ripon, and Crossroads Market and Fortifi Bank in Green Lake, to name a few.
